We are saddened to inform you that on July 7, 2009 Anthony H.N. Schnelling, founder and CEO of Bridge Associates LLC (“Bridge”) and the Trustee of the Impath Bankruptcy Liquidating Trust (the “Trust”), passed away. Mr. Schelling has served beneficial holders well and along with Saul Ewing LLP, as his counsel, have facilitated distributions to beneficial holders in excess of \$94,700,000 since the Trust was established in July 2005.

On September 3, 2009, we will be asking the Honorable Prudence Beatty, the Bankruptcy Judge presiding over the Impath bankruptcy cases, to approve Mr. Phelps as successor trustee. If we do not hear from you by this time, you should assume that Mr. Phelps will be appointed as successor trustee by the Bankruptcy Judge.


